

The Graduate Certificate in Leadership is designed by The Citadel to expand its mission in education and development of principled leaders.

Program Requirements

The Graduate Certificate in Leadership is achieved by completing five (5) three-hour courses at the graduate level.

The certificate can be completed as a stand-alone Certificate in Leadership for individuals who are not enrolled in a degree program.

Students who are currently admitted to a graduate degree program at The Citadel are automatically eligible to pursue the Graduate Certificate in Leadership if they are in one of the following programs: Master of Arts in Social Science, Master of Science in Project Management, or Master of Business Administration.

Course Requirements

BADM-713 Communication for Leadership - Provides insight on the role of organizations as communication systems in which effective writing and speaking are crucial.

BADM-722 Leadership in Organizations - Focuses on the understanding and application of organizational theory and leadership principles.

PSYC-500 Human Growth and Development - Offers an analysis of the principles of human development.

PSYC 570 Social and Cognitive Foundations of Interpersonal Behavior - Presents a survey of the scientific study of social influence, particularly as it relates to matters of leadership.

Application of Leadership - Choose one of the following courses according to your program:

- Master of Arts in Social Science: PSCI 555 or CRMJ 555
- Master of Science in Project Management: PMGT 672
- Master of Business Administration: BADM 740
