

THE CITADEL BOARD OF VISITORS
TELECONFERENCE MINUTES
2 March 2026

The Citadel Board of Visitors (BOV) held a teleconference on 2 March 2026 using Zoom technology in Room 110, Bond Hall, to: consider proposed changes to the *College Regulations* (action item); approve facilities projects (action item); and to discuss other BOV matters.

Voting members absent: Colonel Peter M. McCoy, Sr. A quorum was present.

The meeting followed the agenda at enclosure 1.

The meeting was in compliance with the Freedom of Information Act. Notice was posted in Bond Hall and on the college website 24 hours in advance. The media was notified by electronic means at the same time.

Chair Delleney called the meeting of the Board to order at 1:00 p.m. and called on Mr. Brandenburg to present the proposed changes to the *College Regulations*. Mr. Brandenburg reviewed the changes approved in the previous meeting. After a brief discussion, it was decided no further changes were needed at this time.

Chair Delleney then called on Captain Lamerson to present the facilities projects. Captain Lamberson began his presentation with a brief review of state regulations pertaining to facilities in which projects costing less than \$2M do not require prior approval, however, those costing between \$1-2M do require reporting. He indicated both projects being considered today fall into

the required reporting category. He then presented the Leadership Reaction Course. General Walters reported on the funding for the project.

Colonel Pinson moved:

MOTION

"That the Board of Visitors approves the Leadership Reaction Course project as briefed."

Colonel Love seconded the motion. Members voting in favor of the motion: Delleney, Smith, Love, Goff, Pinson, Dominick, Nicholson, Lyon, and Connor. Members voting against the motion: none. The motion passed.

Colonel Goff departed the meeting at 1:06 p.m.

Captain Lamberson then presented information on the Coward Hall kitchen ventilation project.

Following a brief discussion, Colonel Love moved:

MOTION

"That the Board of Visitors approves the Coward Hall Kitchen Ventilation Upgrades project as briefed."

Colonel Dominick seconded the motion. Members voting in favor of the motion: Delleney, Smith, Love, Pinson, Dominick, Nicholson, Lyon, and Connor. Members voting against the motion: none. The motion passed.

Colonel McCoy joined the meeting at 1:10 p.m.

Chair Delleney congratulated Colonel Jenkinson on recently being awarded the Order of the Palmetto for decades of leadership in Williamsburg County and for his long record of public and civic service.

General Walters then initiated a brief discussion on potential threat issues concerning the current operations in the Middle East. He reported no known local threats at this time. He then deferred to Major General Jones who he indicated would have more current information as the Deputy Adjutant General. Major General Jones reported no current action statewide other than uniform restrictions for Shaw Air Force Base in which airmen leaving the base must be in civilian clothing. Both generals reported they would be monitoring the situation.

Chair Delleney next called on Mrs. Hedstrom, who then provided a brief review of the schedule for the interviews and receptions for the remaining three presidential candidates.

Chair Delleney asked if there was anything else to come before the Board. Hearing none,
