

Course Changes to Fully Approved Online Courses

Significant course changes that will require a new online course review:

- 1. Starting to use or stopping the use of supplemental publisher materials (McGraw Hill, Cengage, Pearson, etc.)
- 2. Changing your course or module-level outcomes.
- 3. Changing, adding, or deleting 20% of your original assessments.
- 4. Changing, adding, or deleting 20% of your original instructional materials.
- 5. Changing 20% or more of your navigation or course structure.
- 6. It has been 5 years since your course was fully approved.
- 7. It has been 1 year since your course was conditionally approved.

Course changes that do NOT require a new online course review:

- 1. Improving or clarifying directions.
- 2. Updating course, department, and/or school policies.
- 3. Changing or adding course materials to keep the course current or supplement instruction.
- 4. Changing or adding lectures, videos, journal articles, screencasts, etc. as this is considered part of your teaching. (Remember all videos need to have captions or have a transcript available.)
