

MAJOR JORDAN P. DIEHL

United States Marine Corps Reserve

Major Jordan P. Diehl is a native of Dayton, Virginia. He enlisted in the Marine Corps in October 2009 and attended recruit training at MCRD Parris Island, SC with Company G, 2nd Recruit Training Battalion. After graduating in March 2010, he attended Marine Combat Training and Marine Corps Engineer School at Camp Lejeune, NC.



In July 2010 he graduated from Marine Corps Engineer School and earned the occupational specialty of Combat Engineer (1371). Private First Class Diehl then reported to Company B, 4th Combat Engineer Battalion in Roanoke Virginia. While there he was promoted to the ranks of Lance Corporal, Corporal and Sergeant while holding the billets of Automatic rifleman, Fire Team Leader, and Squad Leader. In July of 2013 he graduated from Marine Corps Sapper School.

In May 2013 Sergeant Diehl graduated from Bridgewater College with a Bachelor of Science in Information Systems Management. He attended Officer Candidate School, Officer Candidate Course in January 2016 and was commissioned as a 2ndLt in the Marine Corps Reserve. He attended The Basic School with Charlie Company 3-16 in March 2014. Upon graduation, he attended Infantry Officers Course 1-17 where he earned the occupational specialty of Infantry Officer. He then attended Light Armored Reconnaissance Leaders course at Camp Pendleton, CA where he earned the occupational specialty of Light Armored Reconnaissance Officer.

In May of 2017 2ndLt Diehl reported to Company B, 4th Light Armored Reconnaissance Battalion at Fort Detrick, MD and was assigned as a Platoon Commander. During this tour, he deployed with Marine Forces North in support of Operation MEXMAR where he trained Mexican Naval Academy Cadets as well as standing up the country's first Amphibious Reconnaissance Battalion and earned the occupational specialty of Foreign Service Advisor. He was promoted to Captain in May 2020

In June of 2021, he reported to Company F, 4th Light Armored Reconnaissance Battalion in Fort Jackson, SC and was assigned as the Executive Officer. During this tour he conducted training at Infantry Training Exercise and Marine Warfighting Exercise aboard Marine Corps Air Ground Combat Center in Twentynine Palms, CA.

In October of 2024, he was reassigned to 4th Light Battalion as the Assistant Operations Officer. During this time, he was the lead planner for Company D's activation in support of the Unit Deployment Program (UDP) 26.1. In May of 2025 he graduated from The Citadel with a Masters of Science in Leadership.

In May 2025, Captain Diehl was assigned as the Executive Officer of Company D, 4th Light Armored Reconnaissance Battalion for their activation under UDP 26.1 to Okinawa, Japan from October 2025 to May 2026, to include the Korean Marine Exchange Program 26.1. He was promoted to Major in July 2026.

His Personal awards include the Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal, and the Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal (Gold star in lieu of 2nd Award).

Major Diehl joined the Commandants Department in July 2021 as the Company R Teach, Advise, Coach (TAC) Officer. In July of 2023 he was reassigned as the Company A TAC officer until his activation in May of 2025. Upon his return he was reassigned as the Company K TAC Officer.

Major Diehl is married to the former Jennie Winschel of Basye, Virginia. They reside in Moncks Corner, SC with their dog, Ryker.
