LIEUTENANT COLONEL BILL HAUSCHILD

Lieutenant Colonel William A. Hauschild USA, Retired, is the 2nd BN and Echo Company TAC Officer. LTC William Hauschild was born and raised in Bridgewater, NJ. He was commissioned as a 2nd Lieutenant in the Field Artillery from the United States Military Academy in May, 1990, assigned to 101st Airborne Division (Air Assault), Ft. Campbell, KY in January of 1991 and immediately deployed to South West Asia for Operation Desert Storm as an Assistant Battalion Fire Support Officer (FSO) and D Company FSO 3/327 IN. At the 101st he held positions as the C Company FSO 3/327th IN, Battery Fire Direction Officer, and Battery Executive Officer with 2/320th FA, 101st (1990-1994).

LTC Hauschild attended the Field Artillery Officer Advance Course in Jan 1994 and Ranger School at Fort Benning, Georgia in July 1994. Upon completion of Ranger School he was assigned to Vilseck, Germany with 3rd Infantry Division and served as a Task Force FSO for 1/37 Armor and the later as the 1st Brigade FSO when 3rd Infantry Division reflagged to 1st Infantry Division. The Hauschild family then moved to Bamberg, Germany where he served as the Assistant Operations Officer for 1st Battalion, 6th Field Artillery and later assumed Battery Command of C Battery 1-6 FA in Bosnia-Herzegovina. (1994-1998)

Upon completion of battery command LTC Hauschild attended Indiana University and earned a MS in Applied Sports Science (1998-1999) in preparation for his assignment as an instructor and later as an associate professor in the Department of Physical Education at the United States Military Academy, West Point, NY (1999-2002). Following their West Point assignment the Hauschild's attended the Command and General Staff College (CGSC) at Ft. Leavenworth, KS (2002-2003). Upon graduation from CGSC the Hauschild's were assigned to the 10th Mountain Division, Fort Drum, NY and where LTC Hauschild served as the 1st Brigade FSO during a deployment to Operation Enduring Freedom IV in Kandahar, Afghanistan. Hauschild then served as the Battalion Operation Officer for 3rd Battalion, 6th Field Artillery during the unit's transformation to a Fires Battalion and remained as the Operations Officer throughout the unit's deployment to Operation Iraqi Freedom in August of 2005 to June of 2006. LTC Hauschild has served as the Professor of Military Science for Ohio University from June 2006 – until his retirement in December 2010. LTC Hauschild is married to his high school sweetheart, the former Ms. Catherine Crossland, of Solon, OH. They have four children Taggart (who was 23 yrs when he died in 2019), Walker (28 yrs), Emma (26 yrs), and Campbell (22 yrs)
