Steve Liljeberg is from Cleveland, Ohio and attended college at the Citadel in South Carolina. While there he earned a bachelor's degree in criminal justice with a minor in intelligence and homeland security. Upon his graduation in May 2017, he commissioned into the Army as an Air Defense Artillery officer on Active Duty. After completion of Air Defense Basic Officer Leader Course, he was stationed at Fort Hood, TX with 1st Battalion 44th Air Defense Artillery Battalion (PATRIOT), 69th Air Defense Artillery Brigade. He deployed to Kuwait and Bahrain from 2018-2019 in support of Operation Spartan Shield. While there, he served as the Delta Battery Fire Control Platoon leader. He was then transferred to the Battalion Fire Direction Center as a Tactical Director. Captain Liljeberg was then sent to Fort Sill, Oklahoma where he served as the Bravo Battery Executive Officer in the 1st Battalion 79th Field Artillery (Basic Combat Training). Upon the completion of his Active-Duty service obligation in August 2021, he transitioned to the Army Reserve as a Logistics Officer with the 90th Aviation Support Battalion, 11th Expeditionary Combat Aviation Brigade located in Fort Worth, Texas. In October 2022 Captain Liljeberg completed Logistics Captain's Career Course at Fort Lee, Virginia. Captain Liljeberg assumed command of the Headquarters Support Company Rear Detachment from 2021-2022. Captain Liljeberg served in the Support Operations (SPO) section as the Transportation Officer. He is currently assigned to the XVIII Airborne Corps Main Command Post-Operational Detachment (MCP-OD) at Fort Liberty, North Carolina.

His military awards and decorations include the Army Commendation Medal (3), Army Achievement medal, National Defense Service Medal, Global war on Terrorism Expeditionary Medal, Global War on Terrorism Service Medal, Armed Forces Service Medal, Humanitarian Service Medal, Army Service Ribbon, and the Army Overseas Service Ribbon.

While living in North Texas after exiting Active Duty he was a Firefighter/ Emergency Medical Technician with the Wichita Falls Fire Department. Captain Liljeberg prior to becoming a TAC served as a Senior Military Science Instructor teaching Freshman level Army ROTC class at The Citadel. Captain Liljeberg is married to his wife Grace.
