Lt Col (Retired) Jimmy L. Tyson II served a combined 23 years in the United States Navy and Air Force. His final active-duty assignment was as Commander, Central Recruiting Squadron, Air Force Reserve Command (AFRC) Recruiting Service, NAS JB Ft Worth, TX. He led a team of over 100 military and civilian personnel in recruiting Citizen Airmen to posture the Reserve component with proper end-strength manning, directly contributing to national security. Lt Col Tyson served as the direct advisor to the 10th Air Force Commander, was a senior AFRC recruiting liaison to Reserve Wing Commanders, and a senior advisor to the AFRC Recruiting Service Commander.



Lt Col Tyson was born in Charleston, S.C., and enlisted in the active-duty Navy in 1994. After six years of service, he attended Officer Training School with the Air Force, where he served for six years on active duty as an Acquisition Officer and ROTC Instructor. After separating from active duty, Lt Col Tyson joined the Air Force Reserve as a Medical Service Corps Officer, where he served for two years. In 2009, he became an Active Guard Reservist (AGR) with AFRC Recruiting Service, where he served as an Operations Officer, Chief of Advertising, and two tours as a recruiting Squadron Commander until his retirement in 2019.

Lt Col Tyson and his wife are both natives of Charleston, SC and have two children.
