

ince its founding in 1996, The Gold Star Journal has honored scholarship, annually for Corps Day, through the publication of the best cross-disciplinary nonfiction papers written by Citadel undergraduate and graduate students. The featured authors garner fame within the greater Citadel community. The journal inspires students to pursue research opportunities, to improve their writing and editing skills,



and to gain publishing experience.

The 21 editions have featured 129 papers. Forty-eight students have served as editors, with 20 students serving at least two years. In recent years, awards have been given for The Best Overall Paper, The Best Undergraduate Paper and The Best Graduate Paper.
