Leadership Development Transcript

The purpose of the leadership transcript is to highlight the leadership experiences and development of students that take place outside of the classroom. These experiences include civic engagement, study abroad, internship, research, and leadership roles in the cadet chain of command, as well as club sports and various other campus organizations. The transcript also functions as a complement to the academic transcript and is useful as a tool to encourage student involvement in non-classroom activities that foster enhancement of skills beyond the classroom experience. Content approved for inclusion in the Leadership Development Transcript is vetted by the Leadership Development Committee.

The Citadel validates all information presented on the transcript. Validation occurs within each program responsible for the experiences; therefore, students are not permitted to enter any experiences onto their Leadership Development Transcript. The transcript is an official document of The Citadel that students can utilize to showcase their leadership initiatives. Leadership

Many cadets exercise formal leadership responsibilities as members of the South Carolina Corps of Cadet (SCCC) chain of command. In non-commissioned officer (NCO) positions, cadets direct leadership of individual and small teams. As officers, they lead larger units by making increasing use of delegation and leading through other leaders. As staff NCOs and officers, cadets demonstrate administrative expertise in a specific functional area. Therefore, all military titles reference cadet leadership in these roles.
