YOUR CAMPUS-WIDE **ADVISING TEAM**

TAC OFFICERS

Retired or reserve military officers who support cadets in leadership, discipline, and academic guidance as part of daily company life.

PRIMARY ADVISORS

Faculty or staff assigned by department who provide guidance on course selection, career paths, & support resources. Regular meetings are encouraged each semester.

COMPANY/BATTALION ADVISORS

Faculty or staff who work with the cadet chain-of-command to support academic success and connect cadets with campus resources.

ICRA

CITADEL SUCCESS INSTITUTE (CSI)

A ~month-long summer transition program that gives incoming cadets a head start academically, physically, and socially at The Citadel. During CSI, participants earn college credit in core courses, enhance study strategies, develop time management & organizational skills, build support networks through peer & campus mentor connections, and navigate campus & college life before formal cadet training begins. **CSI students consistently enter the fall** semester better prepared, more confident, & more academically successful than their peers who do not attend.
